

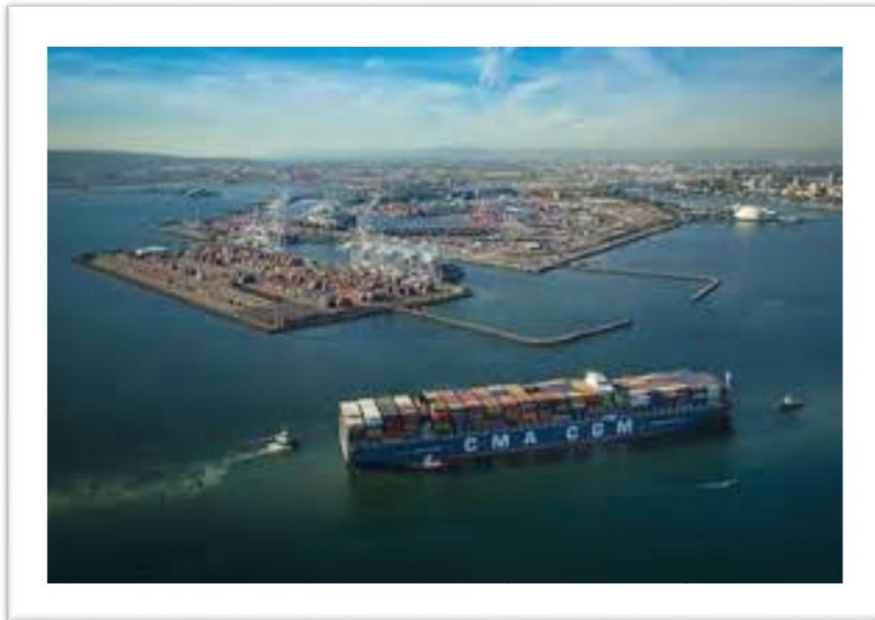

22nd Annual Seaport Operations Tour & Harbor Cruise Luncheon

**Wednesday, July 15, 2015
7:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.**



JOIN WITOC for our 22nd Annual Seaport Operations Tour & Harbor Cruise Luncheon. We’re looking forward to an exciting day of touring some great facilities in the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach along with lunch aboard the “Christopher” Yacht in the Port of Long Beach. Come learn from and network with port authorities, industry professionals, container terminal and freight station operators, warehouse and distribution proprietors and view cargo movements and port operations from the ground, rail and sea.

Highlights of this year’s tour include:

- Mid-Year Update from US Customs & Border Protection (CBP) on “what’s trending” at the seaports on in-bound and out-bound cargo exams. This will be an executive morning briefing presented by CBP Los Angeles Field and Port Office Executive Management during a breakfast at Price Transfer, Inc.
- Tour of the Marine Exchange of Southern California to see how vessel movements are tracked at all major ports in Southern California.
- Tour of the Long Beach Container Terminal to see the latest updates to the first state-of-the-art fully automated terminal in the USA with a look at the progress of the \$1.3 billion construction project at “Middle Harbor” and see first-hand unloading of cargo from a vessel calling into port and cargo screening processes by CBP.

- Luncheon and narrated tour of the Port of Long Beach harbor aboard the "Christopher" with the opportunity to meet and greet Harbor Commissioners from the Port.
- View of the Alameda Corridor and tour of Union Pacific Railroad's intermodal container shipping facility in Long Beach.

This tour is a sell-out every year and is highly recommended for importers, exporters, customs brokers, freight forwarders, and personnel in legal, traffic, logistics, purchasing sales departments, warehouse operations, consultants and trade compliance professionals.

Port Tour Stops

Price Transfer, Inc. – A continental breakfast and mid-year update of latest developments and trends in cargo exams by Executive Management of CBP Field and Port offices will kick-off this year's tour. This briefing will be held at the corporate headquarters of Price Transfer located in Rancho Dominguez. Price Transfer is the largest provider of CBP CES Examination Services in the United States. They operate multiple facilities strategically located near the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach, including two CBP Centralized Examination Stations, a CBP Bonded Container Freight Station, bonded warehousing and transportation services.

Marine Exchange of Southern California – The Marine Exchange tracks vessel movement at all four major ports in Southern California: Hueneme, Los Angeles, Long Beach, and San Diego and acts as a clearing house for up-to-date information. The Exchange is a 93-year old organization dedicated to the development and efficient flow of maritime commerce through our region. It is the Maritime Information Center for the Los-Angeles-Long Beach Port Complex. The facility maintains a continuous 24-hour service and utilizes a state-of-the-art, comprehensive, computerized database to provide vital statistics and information on all ships calling into the four ports which is shared with dozens of government agencies and harbor officials. The stop here will include an actual walking tour of the Marine Exchange and its daily operations. The site is located in the Angel's Gate Park, overlooking Point Fermin in San Pedro just above the mouth of the Los Angeles Harbor.

Long Beach Container Terminal LLC, an OOIL Group Company – The LBCT is a marine terminal located adjacent to a deep water turning basin on Pier F, Berths 6-10 in the Port of Long Beach. This berth is the deepest dredged dockside of any US Pacific Coast port. The terminal rests on approximately 105 acres. With the major construction upgrades in progress, including the \$1.3 billion Middle Harbor Redevelopment Project which is transforming this terminal into the only state-of-the-art, fully automated container terminal in the USA, you will not want to miss this on-site guided tour of the latest progress. It is amazing. The stop here will also include a view of the ground operations at the marine terminal, likely vessel loading and unloading, CBP x-ray exams/procedures on dock, trucking operations, Pier Pass, cargo release and terminal procedures. This facility is due to become fully on-line by November 2015.

Port of Long Beach Narrated Harbor Cruise & Luncheon – The Port of Long Beach is the second busiest port in the USA and ranks 18th busiest port worldwide. Founded in 1911, POLB is a premier gateway for trade between the US and Asia, occupying 3,200 acres of land, 10 piers, 80 berths, and 22 shipping terminals. On June 17, 2014, the POLB was recognized as the "Best Green Seaport" at the annual Asian Freight & Supply Chain Awards hosted in Shanghai, China by the Cargonews Asia shipping publication. This tour stop will begin aboard the "Christopher" Yacht loading at Rainbow Harbor in the heart of Shoreline Village, Long Beach. Our group will have an opportunity to meet and greet invited LB Port Harbor Commissioners and port officials will provide a narrated tour of the seaport during the luncheon cruise. The tour will pass through the harbor showing terminal handling operations, ship calls, building and rigging sites, all from the water. This tour stop is always a favorite and one will learn about the Port's infrastructure and how they are creating the Port of the Future.

Union Pacific Railroad & the Alameda Corridor – The Alameda Corridor is notable for its “Mid-Corridor Trench,” a below ground, triple-tracked rail line. Our group will have an aerial view of the Corridor and we will learn about the use of the corridor in the movement of goods from dock to destination at the Union Pacific Railroad Intermodal Container Transfer Facility in Long Beach. This tour stop will include a briefing by UP officials about the rail network, infrastructure and the state-of-the art locomotives for use in the LA basin rail yards, among other updates. There will be a guided tour of the intermodal container shipping yard and container loading process at this facility. Union Pacific Railroad is one America’s most recognized companies, connecting 23 states in the western two-thirds of the country by rail, providing a critical link in the global supply chain. UP boasts 8,300 locomotives and over 32,000 route rail miles.
