The Senior Trade Analyst ensures compliance with all international trade laws and regulations pertaining to Thermo Fisher Scientific in a manner to satisfy obligations under the laws and regulations of the United States and other countries. It involves a combination of creativity, routine work, and varied tasks. The successful candidate will determine and assign Export and Import information, process export license applications, perform data mining and transfer tasks, generate reports and metrics, and resolve process issues to ensure global standardization of product data and processes within Thermo Fisher. In addition, this person will occasionally work in a leadership function in support of the Trade Compliance manager, and act as an escalation point for the team in relation to daily operational requirements.

### **What will you do?**

- Export license determination and application using SNAPR
- Perform and ensure process for proper screening and review of transaction entities, including denied and restricted party screening.
- Ensure the proper HTS classification, ECCN, valuation, marking, and country of origin of imported and exported merchandise.
- Manage the Foreign Visitor process and Visa Invitation Letters
- Ensure compliance with Customs regulations, and all other partnering government agencies; maintain Customs and Export compliance databases as necessary
- Investigate options to ensure the proper use of duty preference programs including Free Trade Agreements.
- Act as a resource for researching, providing guidance, and responding to Customs and Export compliance questions from various company departments and divisions
- Serve as contact to provide Customs entry discrepancy resolution and to ensure timely processing of entries
- Support the development, maintenance, and delivery of internal training programs as necessary
- Assist in the review, development, implementation, and regular update of Trade Compliance work instructions and procedures
- Audit import entry filings; resolve discrepancies, request appropriate corrections, reconcile or protest as appropriate; verify valuation methodology including additions and subtractions such as assists and royalties; process post-entry amendments.
- Audit export transactions for compliance with U.S. Export Control Regulations, including AES submissions; ensure compliance with export control regulations.
- Identify opportunities for duty refunds and cost savings including but not limited to classification, valuation, trade programs, and duty drawback.
- Generate compliance metrics for reporting within the department and to management
- Provide leadership to Trade Compliance team and ensure day-to-day monitoring import and export requirements of the business unit.
- Perform other compliance related duties and/or projects as required, including, but not limited, to supply chain security, export compliance, and performing audits

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- Interact effectively with multiple functional areas including management, supply chain, distribution, engineering, finance, IT and legal.
- Other duties as assigned
